2. All exhibits must be received before close of entries and will be accepted during the week before the Show.
NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
3. The judges decision will be final.
4. Previous prizewinning articles may not be entered.
5. All entries must be clearly written on the entry form to ensure it goes into the correct class.
6. The Judges may withhold all prizes if they consider no exhibit worthy of a prize. If there are not more than three entries in any one class, the prize may be curtailed. Where equal first prizes are awarded, no second prize will be awarded and the prize money will be equally divided, but full first, or second, points will be awarded to each exhibit.
7. Prize money may be collected from the Secretary's Office AFTER 12 noon on Saturday
8. **Exhibits may be collected from pavilion AFTER 5:00pm on Sunday. Displays will be closed at 4.30pm to enable this to assist security. Under no circumstances may exhibits be removed before 5:00pm or without the knowledge of the Steward in charge of the section.**

50. WOOL ARTICLE/GARMENT ROYAL EASTER SHOW STATE COMPETITION (Mid North Coast Group of Agricultural Societies)

Three different types of wool articles and/or garments, minimum 80% sheep's wool.

Three items must be submitted.

Conditions:

1. For the purpose of this competition the following definitions apply:
 - a. **Garment:** an item that can be worn e.g. dress, jacket, scarf, hat
 - b. **Article:** a utility item that is not worn but can be used in the home, e.g. blanket, with an outfit e.g. bag, for amusement e.g. toy, as a decoration e.g. picture, etc.
2. The **whole** article and/or garment must be constructed of, and contain a minimum of **80% sheep's wool**.
3. Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc. and must be hand crafted (use of sewing machine is permitted).
4. **A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit.** If a label is not available as a hand spun/felted, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.
5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a **group of individuals, or an organisation.**
6. All three articles/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local Show and made by the exhibitor/s.
7. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
8. Winning Entry eligible for entry in the Sydney Royal Easter Show in 2018.
